VACANCIES AT BOTH SYLMAR AND SANTA FE SPRINGS
(approximate 6-month seasonal hire with tentative start date between MAY and JULY
2021)**

Under general direction of the Operations Supervisor and direct supervision of the Vector Control Specialist IV Lead, the Mosquito Control Technician (MCT) performs inspections and control operations relative to mosquito vector problems in an assigned area. The MCT exercises safe and proper judgment in the execution of daily vector control assignments. The MCT position does not possess a state certification. An incumbent must be able to perform assignments under the direct supervision of certified District personnel, including either a Vector Control Specialist IV Lead or Operations Supervisor. This classification works relatively independently and is accountable for vehicle safety, the safe use of chemical application equipment, recording work-related data, and presenting a good public image of the District. Other duties as assigned.

This assignment will be located at either the Santa Fe Springs or Sylmar branch office. The duration of work is seasonal/temporary, usually beginning with the onset of mosquito season and will last for approximately six months. This assignment is considered "at-will," does not serve a probation period and will not gain permanency. This position does not qualify to receive District health benefits, vacation time or holiday pay.

ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS:

The MCT will inspect sources suspected of producing mosquitoes (i.e. gutters); gather samples and collect mosquito specimens from sources; record daily sampling data accurately; refer all citizen concerns or questions regarding mosquito control to the incumbent's Vector Control Specialist IV Lead or Operations Supervisor; operate various types of vehicles for pesticide application; may be assigned to assist in maintenance and repair of buildings and grounds; assist with service requests associated with premises inspection activity; perform administrative duties as needed; communicate with homeowners/residents, and gather data. Incumbent must keep a neat and professional appearance during work hours.

QUALIFICATIONS:

Incumbent shall have the knowledge to perform fundamental arithmetic calculations and have

basic math skills. The MCT will have the ability to communicate with staff and public in a tactful and courteous manner; write legibly and maintain accurate records; and accept direction and various work assignments, as needed. He/she will have skills in using common hand and power tools; operate vehicles in a safe and legal manner; record daily work-related activities on paper and/or mobile devices; have the ability to lift objects weighing 50 or fewer pounds; assist in lifting objects weighing in excess of 50 pounds; adhere to safety policies and procedures and maintain good judgment at all times. The incumbent must possess excellent communication (verbal & written) and, interpersonal skills, have the ability to problem solve, ability to use and operate a mobile tablet device including associated software applications, and have excellent customer service skills. Incumbents must be able to perform the essential functions of the position with or without accommodation.

SUPPLEMENTAL INFORMATION:

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

Education: Graduation from high school or its equivalent.

Experience: Any experience, education or training which demonstrates the abilities and knowledge to perform the essential functions of the position.

Preferred Language: Bilingual.

SPECIAL WORKING CONDITIONS

Medium Work – Incumbents in this class perform work which involves frequent lifting, pushing and/or pulling of objects of approximately 50 pounds. Assisting in lifting heavier objects is an infrequent aspect of this class.

Mobility – Incumbents must have complete and normal mobility of arms to reach and dexterity of hands to grasp and manipulate small objects; be able to stand, stoop, reach and bend and to walk on uneven terrain, such as field, dirt banks, natural and improved stream, river or drainage beds, and ponds.

Other Conditions – Incumbent is required to handle hazardous substances and a variety of organisms; work, when necessary, in inclement weather.

LICENSE

Possession of a current valid driver's license is required. Employees in this position will be enrolled in the Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) Government Employer Pull Notice Program which confirms possession of a valid driver's license and reflects driving records during course of employment with GLACVCD. Must be insurable with the District's insurance carrier.

CONDITION OF EMPLOYMENT

District appointments are contingent upon successful completion of a post-offer medical examination with the ability to lift up to 50 lbs., including drug screening to comply with our Drug Free Workplace policy, a background check including references and employment history, and a Live-Scan fingerprint check through the Department of Justice.

California Code of Regulations, Title 8, Section 5144, Appendix A requires an employee to comply with mandatory Fit Testing Procedures.

The successful candidate will be required to provide identification and employment eligibility as outlined in the Immigration Reform and Control Act.
