

Mosquito and Vector Control Association of California January 2025 Report to the Board of Directors Legislative Committee

1. Legislative Advocacy Day (LAD)

- a. Action steps: Plan and Coordinate early 2025 between Legislative and PR Committee with Assistance from AMG and KP. Will be recognizing Senator Stern for support and SB 1251. Educate legislators on Public Health Uses of Pesticides (how it is different from Ag.)
- b. Resources needed: Legislative Day Training, Leave Back Materials, Award for Senator Stern

 - iii. March 2025 Hold LAD training Webinar week prior to LAD; Post training link; LAD will be held on March 25th at the Embassy Suites in Sacramento as part of the Spring Meeting.

Action steps: Legislative Committee to work with KP staff reviewing, identifying, and tracking introduced legislation; determine positions on introduced legislation that impacts IVM programs; Stay connected with CSDA legislative effort (via Clausnitzer and Young) and determine as an Association what bills MVCAC may want to support or oppose alongside CSDA.
